END OF SEASON AQUATHLON

Billed as a triathlon with a difference our farewell event to the multi-sport competitive season on Saturday 30 September 2006 had to be amended when heavy rain during the previous week meant that the cycling phase had to be abandoned for fear of turning St Andrews School's sports pitch into a ploughed field. Reluctantly we reverted to our tried and tested aquathlon format at the Aquarena and Beach House Grounds, but we will try to stage an adapted triathlon in 2007. That said the revised event went really well with an excellent turnout and assisted by fine weather including a moderate air temperature. Overall there were 19 entries from across the age groups and in a change to the usual timetable the Tristar 3 race started proceedings. **Alastair** Hardinge emerged from the pool after the 300m swim with a substantial lead and galloped round the run course of 1800m at such a speed that some officials were fretting that he might arrive at the finish line before the Timekeeper, but in the nick of time Peter Eldridge was at his post to clock Alastair as he crossed the line to win the T3 Boys race, which was a feat that also won him a Race Number Belt as the best performance of the day. **Sam** Maloney was the only other T3 Boy to enter and although finishing a little way behind Al he completed both stages with good form. The Girls T3 race had 6 entries. **Bethany** Taylor and **Sarah** Blacker resumed their friendly rivalry of the summer season. Sarah put in her usual strong swim and benefitted from the shorter run distance on this occasion to take the honours. Behind them came **Hannah** Seth, **Victoria** Seth, **Nina** Reymond, and **Toni** Harris all of whom put in very steady performances and showed they have really adapted to multi-sport events. Despite struggling with an injury during the previous week **Max** Felton completed the 200m swim and 1400m run in fine style to win the Tristar 2 Boys race but behind him **Iain** Taylor was also demonstrating great improvement by recording a pb for the run course and distance. In the Tristar 2 Girls race **Louise** Maloney took the honours with a very controlled performance from a fast finishing **Elissa** Flynn whilst **Amy**, **Millie** and **Becky** Rodemark also put in good steady performances. In the Tristar 1 Boys race **Sam** Empson made his debut in multi-sports events and coped very well with the new experience and won a medal for his efforts. Veteran campaigner **Maia** Coates won the T1 Girls award and another debutant was **Alexis** Felton in the Tristar Start Girls race who made it a golden double for the Felton family. **Lewis** Moreton completed the line up with victory in the Tristar Start Boys race. A new award for the fastest Transition time was made to Bethany Taylor who blitzed through in 26 seconds. Once again this was a brilliant occasion thanks to the enthusiasm and sportsmanship of the athletes and all the parents who supported them. Special thanks to Race Director Ann Maloney, to Peter Eldridge for timekeeping, to Neale Maloney for providing a computerised results service, to everybody who helped marshal the run course, and to Niki Treacy and South Downs Bikes for supplying water bottles as an extra prize for the age group winners. Special mention also to Peter Flynn who was too unwell on the day to take part but helped marshal the run course. Finally, everybody was very appreciative of the cakes supplied by Julia Flynn and Julie Felton which made the perfect end to a very enjoyable event.

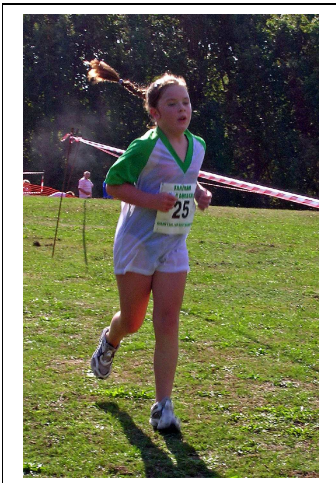

FAREHAM AQUATHLON

It seems a long time ago but on 27 August 2 of our most competitive Otters, Maia Coates and Max Felton, took part in the Fareham Aquathlon promoted by Chapel Tristars. The pool was only 17m long so there were lots of turns involved in even the shortest races and the run phase was held over a testing undulating circuit that included tight turns all of which served to disrupt even pace running. Conditions were good and both our athletes did us proud. In the Tristar 1 Girls Race Maia struggled with her asthma on the run but did well to keep going and finish with her usual determination. Max was just back from holiday so his connections had some concern about his fitness. Whether it was visualising being pursued by jelly fish or just his usual guts and determination, Max put in a very solid performance and even managed a smile for the cameras at the start of the second lap of the run course. Well done to both athletes and thanks for turning out in the peak holiday season. For the record Maia was 8th in her race and Max 6th.



2006 Top Otter Group Awards (TOGA's)

Otters with good memories will recall that at the start of the competitive season we announced the introduction of the TOGA's. The aim of which was to encourage participation in the races that the club was targeting as part of its competition programme. To be considered for a TOGA an Otter had to compete in three of the seven designated races, which were our May Day Aquathlon, the Hamble, Portsmouth, Brighton, Fareham Aquathlons, and the Arun & Crawley Triathlons. Each Otter was ranked in accordance to where they finished in relation to the other club members in each race. The best 3 positions out of all the races an athlete entered contributed to the TOGA. So, an Otter who was 1st Otter in 2 races, 3rd in one and 4th in another would have a final score of 5 points (1 + 1 + 3 with the 4th place being discounted). TOGA's were up for grabs for boys and girls in each Tristar Group. 26 members did at least 1 race and of these 13 did 2 or more races but 7 individuals (**Maia Coates, Max Felton, Dan MacDonald, Iain Taylor, Elissa Flynn, Sarah Blacker and Bethany Taylor**) managed to do 3 or more and we salute them all for this special effort. The most competitive age group was the Boys Tristar 2 with Dan and Max sharing the honours right up to the end when Max's outing at Fareham secured him the TOGA. Iain epitomised our philosophy of it's not so much about where you come but how you compete that counts, and he always gave 100%. The other keenly contested group was the Tristar 3 Girls category with Bethany and Sarah involved in some close encounters. Beth was more suited to the longer run distances in the regional series so won out in the end but Sarah was never far behind. For both girls the step up in distance for the regional events from last year was challenging and it is to their credit that they stayed involved. Although their groups were uncontested, Elissa and Maia still had to put the effort in to secure their awards so well done girls. The awards will be presented to the winners at a presentation event that will be held in January. More details to follow later.

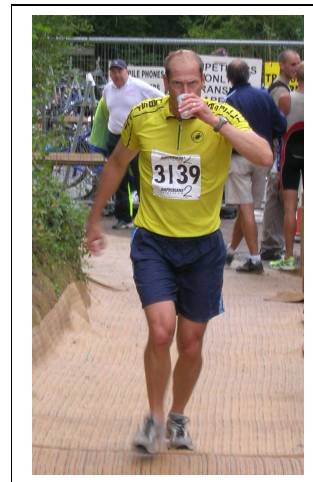


THE ATHLETES FORUM
